



**8th-CDX, \$49,560, Alw, NW1X, 3yo/up, f/m, 6f, 1:10 2/5, ft.**  
**GOLDEN THIEF (f, 3, [Cat Thief](#)--Amber Gold, by Mr. Prospector)**, in the money in six of seven starts this term, was third over this track and trip June 27. In her final start for trainer Helen Pitts, she came home fourth over the synthetic surface at Arlington July 15 and was installed the 2-1 choice in this return to the dirt. Close up in fourth through the opening quarter, the \$23,000 KEESEP yearling took on Simply Divine (Grand Slam) in the stretch and outgamed that rival to score by 1 1/2 lengths. **QUEEN OF INDIA (f, 3, [Proudest Romeo](#)--Juke Box Queen, by Broad Brush)** had not been out since a late-running win in her debut over one mile at Arlington Park July 6. The 9-5 second choice pressed the pace, took charge with authority down the lane and drew clear to win by 3 1/2 lengths. Lifetime Record: 2-2-0-0, \$33,600. O/B-Dr K K & Dr V Devi Jayaraman (FL). **4th-CDX, \$48,000, Msw, 2yo, f, 1 1/16mT, 1:46 1/5, fm.**  
**YIPPEY YIP (f, 2, [Broken Vow](#)--Fighting Words, by Lord At War {Arg})** didn't show much during a third-place finish going six panels over the Keeneland Polytrack Oct. 20. Let go at 8-1 for her route and turf bow, the dark bay settled off the early pace, swung five wide for the stretch drive and drew off to post a two-length victory over favored General Consensus (Giant's Causeway). Dynaffair (Dynaformer) came home eighth and Pristine Lady (El Prado {Ire}) was 12th. Lifetime Record: 2-1-0-0, \$32,512. O-Louis Lee Haggin III. B-Alma H & Louis Lee Haggin (KY). T-Philip J Oliver.

**10th-CDX, \$48,000, Msw, 3yo/up, 6 1/2f, 1:16 4/5, ft.**  
**SILVER LORD (c, 4, [Unbridled's Song](#)--Whatamiss, by Miswaki)**, a \$280,000 KEESEP yearling, closed to be second in his debut at Retama Park Oct. 27. Let go at 14-1, the gray colt raced four wide while contesting the early fractions. He took the lead after a half mile and inched clear to best Maria's Charm (Maria's Mon) by 1 1/4 lengths.
